

**District English Learners Advisory Committee
DELAC Minutes
September 9, 2022
In Person**

A. OPENING PROCEDURES

a. Call to Order Next Meeting

Bonner Montler called the meeting to order at 9:06 a.m.

b. Review and Approve Agenda Bonner Montler reviewed the agenda. Jennifer Mahoney motioned to approve the agenda and Yvette Gonzalez seconded the motion. The Ayes voted verbally to approve.

B. PUBLIC COMMUNICATION

No items were presented.

C. AGENDA ITEMS

a. Approval of May 13, 2022 Minutes Bonner reviewed the previous DELAC's minutes. Jennifer Mahoney motioned to approve the minutes and Marisella Lopez-Villalva seconded. The Ayes voted verbally to approve.

b. ELOP – No Cost Childcare – Chrishaun Green

Chrishaun presented information regarding new guidelines for Santee School District's before/after school programs. All students designated as English learners, free/reduced school lunch, and/or homeless/foster youth may now participate in the programs free of charge. Furthermore, Project Safe will provide 30 days of childcare during the summer and is required to include academic and physical enrichment every day.

c. Roles and DELAC Responsibilities – Bonner Montler

Bonner summarized the roles and responsibilities of DELAC which is meant to advise the district as it assists the 590+ children in the district designated as English learners.

d. Annual and Initial Parent/Notification Letter/Title I and III

Bonner described the district's protocol for identifying children who might be English learners. Once identified, the student must then show that s/he/they is/are eligible for reclassification as fluent English-proficient (RFEP), which includes state criteria (ELPAC results) and local education agency criteria (iReady Reading assessment, ELA performance task, report card grades).

e. California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) Presentation

Bonner addressed the results of last spring's CAASPP. For both the ELA and mathematics portion of the assessment, roughly half the district met or exceeded

the state standards despite the lack of “normal”, consistent, in-person education for the past two years. Santee School District also outperformed nearly all other districts in San Diego County, with “ever-English learners” (present and reclassified English learners) outperforming all districts except Poway. All results will be published online through the Department of Education later this year and individual results are currently available in PowerSchool.
