

Summary of Completed Items in Phase 1 & the Beginning of Phase 2

Phase 1 completion included the following items: Seco.

There is currently \$38.5 million in State-matching funds that were finally released recently to the Santee School District. Of this \$38.5 million, \$12.2 million will be used to pay back bridge financing that was secured in June 2009.

Completion Plans for the Modernization Program

Phase 3 includes one modernization at Pepper Drive School and three Junior High classroom additions for Hill Creek, Chet F. Harritt and Pepper Drive schools. The Hill Creek addition is tentatively scheduled for construction to start during the summer of 2011 depending upon sufficient remaining funds. Modernization of five schools at Cajon Park, Carlton Hills, Carlton Oaks, Sycamore Canyon, and Rio

Construction of four new Junior High buildings at Cajon Park, Carlton Hills, Carlton Oaks, and Rio

Phase 2 completion items included both infrastructure and plan checks for future additions as follows: Underground electrical infrastructure work completed at PRIDE Academy at Prospect Avenue and Chet F. Harritt Schools and partially at Hill Creek School with their Solar project.

Plan check and permits for Phase 2 construction, 10-classroom additions were completed.

After much delay, State funding approvals of \$38.5 million were received between September 2010 and February 2011 allowing construction plans to move forward for 2011-2012.

The continuation of phase 2 includes three school modernizations: Chet F. Harritt, Hill Creek, and PRIDE Academy at Prospect Avenue. As stated above, applications have been submitted for additional allocations from the State of approximately \$5.5 million, although the acceptance and timing of these funds

> committed to completing the entire CIP program in the most expedient and fiscally prudent way possible.
