## PUBLIC NOTICE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

**Employment**: The SSD does not discriminate on the basis of disability in its hiring or employment practices and complies with all regulations promulgated by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission under Title I of the ADA and the Fair Employment and Housing Act.
